

Spring 2020 Conditions of Admission First Year/Freshman Students

Congratulations! Your academic achievements have earned you an offer of admission to the University of California, Merced. You must submit a Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) by Nov. 1, 2019, or the date shown on your UC Merced student portal, and meet the Conditions of Admission in order to secure your admission to UC Merced. Failure to submit your SIR may result in your admission being withdrawn.

Before submitting your SIR, please read and make sure you understand the Conditions of Admission listed below. Submitting your SIR and accepting this offer of admission signifies your acknowledgment that failure to satisfy any of the conditions listed below will result in UC Merced withdrawing the offer of admission. Please note that the \$250 SIR deposit is nonrefundable, even if your offer of admission is withdrawn.

Our admission decision was based on the information you reported in your application. Applicants are solely responsible for the accuracy and completeness of all academic information they report to UC Merced.

Therefore, if the self-reported information in your application or any updates are inconsistent with your actual grades and courses, it will result in cancellation of admission and may jeopardize future admission to any campus of the University of California. As indicated in Condition No. 1 below, any changes in your information or low grades must be reported to the Office of Admissions immediately, regardless of whether you believe your admission will be affected.

Although UC Merced maintains the right to withdraw any offer of admission if any of the conditions listed below are not met, if you make us aware of any low grades or changes, we may be able to suggest alternatives in the event your admission appears to be jeopardized. Report any low grades and changes by completing the "myCourseUpdates" form in your student portal at my.ucmerced.edu.

First year applicants must:

- 1. Maintain eligibility and complete all courses you indicated as "in progress" or "planned" with grades of C or better. If you receive a D, F, W, NP or NC grade, or change your schedule from what you indicated on your application (including adding or withdrawing from any courses or enrolling in a college other than previously indicated), you must notify the Office of Admissions immediately by completing the "myCourseUpdates" form in your student portal.
 - Please note: We strongly discourage you from changing your schedule. Also note that one D or F grade in your current term may cause you to be ineligible for admission to the University of California. If you receive a grade lower than a C, you are obligated to report it to UC Merced immediately.
- 2. Ensure that official standardized test results from the ACT with Writing, SAT Reasoning or SAT with Essay test are submitted to the Office of Admissions by **Jan. 10, 2020**.
- 3. If you have completed any Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) exams, submit official exam scores to the Office of Admissions by **Jan. 10, 2020**.
- 4. Ensure that final official transcripts from high schools and all higher-education institutions you attended are submitted to the Office of Admissions. These transcripts must be postmarked or electronically submitted on or before **Jan. 10, 2020**. Final official high school transcripts must show grades through graduation, as well as the month, day and year of your graduation (our office also will accept a diploma or equivalent as proof of graduation date).
- 5. Register for courses in November 2019 during the time slot that is assigned to you, but no later than December 15, 2019.
- 6. Adhere to the UC Merced student code of conduct, found at ucm.edu/v/conduct.
